'GIVING IN KIND'

We're going to be trialling a new way for all of us to give a little extra financially to The Minster by 'giving in kind'. There are a variety of consumables which we use as a church from some cleaning materials which we can't purchase in bulk, to toilet paper, tea and biscuits for refreshment. From this weekend there will be a section on the noticeboard in church labelled 'Giving in Kind' and under this will be placed post-it notes which will be dated and, on them, say what needs to be purchased. For example, '23rd February, Fairtrade bag of white granulated sugar' '25th February, Recycled toilet paper, 4 pack'. If you would be happy to buy that item, you would then take the post-it note off the noticeboard, pop to the Co-op, Tesco or food store of choice, buy whatever is on the post-it note and deliver it to Julie in the office or to whoever greets you on a Sunday. Setting aside extra money regularly can I know be challenging, but if in response to The Minster's need to raise its income you would like to help on this more ad hoc basis, making these small gifts is another way we can all help. MOTHERING SUNDAY POSIES

This year we're going to try something a little different for the 10.30am service at The Minster on Mothering Sunday (10th March). If you're able to, please would you bring to

church a small, wrapped posy of flowers and greenery from the garden. Simple will be just fine – it's the thought that counts. The posies will be collected as we arrive at church and then distributed towards the end of the service so that everyone present is able to take home some (hopefully) different flowers. We'll also make sure that there are some spare posies made. You can then either keep the flowers you're given or, if you'd like to, give them away to someone you know who would appreciate them – particularly if they will be alone or housebound on a day when so many people see friends and family.

LOOKING AHEAD TO HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

Although it may feel that Lent has only just begun, it might be good to begin to consider how you will mark the most solemn and joyful week in the Christian calendar. We hope to have a flier with all services ready soon but it's worth thinking now about which of those you'll be able to join us for: from the drama of Palm Sunday, the mixed emotions of Maundy Thursday, the sadness of Good Friday, the anticipation of Holy Saturday and, finally, the rejoicing of Easter Day. It's probably helpful to remind you too that the clocks go forwards on Easter Day! I'm also delighted to let you know that we will be sharing in some of the services of Holy Week with our Christian brothers and sisters from other denominations in Ilminster. So, whilst Bank Holiday weekends are obviously important times with family and friends, hopefully you'll be able to balance special time with those you love alongside marking Jesus' death and resurrection as fully as possible.
